

The Kanji above is "Tanabata" which is a traditional festival held on the 7th of July every year (Star Festival). It is based on the ancient legend of the stars Altair and Vega, which are usually separated by the Milky Way. On the 7th night of the 7th month, Altair and Vega are visible in the sky close to each other. Japanese people celebrate this event by writing their wishes on a long piece of paper and hanging it on a bamboo tree.






